SUMMARY

The Greater Easton Development Partnership aimed to reduce waste associated with single use plastics, and also offer access fresh (free) drinking water for all at the Easton Farmers' Market, Live at the Falls, and general users of the City of Easton's Scott Park.

The City of Easton was a key partner in both offering space for the water station and handling all aspects of construction/installation.

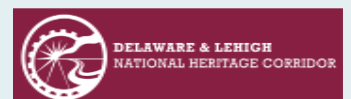
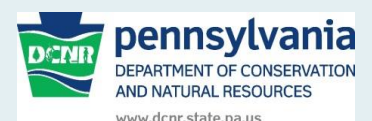


CHALLENGE

There were some initial challenges in communicating the need for the water station, and also concerns about vandalism, but, in the end, the City of Easton was supportive of the water station installation.

SOLUTION

The Greater Easton Development Partnership was able to successfully advocate for the water station in Scott Park, and worked with the City to install the station once GEDP purchased and received the grant-funded equipment.

RESULTS

We expect to reduce the number of plastic bottles sold and disposed of at the Easton Farmers' Market, Live at the Falls, and other events in Scott Park. We also hope to support increased community health with access to fresh water in a public setting.
